



Are you planning to apply for an Erasmus mobility scheme in Europe?

Pending the publication of the new call for applications (not before January), you should find out how your language proficiency will be assessed.

Unlike previous years, there will be NO special language tests this year: your knowledge will be assessed through the suitability tests (idoneità) and any language exams passed or certificates awarded. This information will be extracted from the CLA (University Language Centre) database and your online exams booklet.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE

If you are in possession of a [recognised certificate](#), you must submit it to the CLA (if you have not already done so) by e-mail (<mailto:infocla@unisi.it> for students in Siena and cla-ar@unisi.it for students in Arezzo).

English language proficiency is assessed in the usual manner. Read [here for B1](#) and [here for B2](#).

LANGUAGES OTHER THAN ENGLISH

If you think you have non-certified skills in a language OTHER THAN ENGLISH, you must contact the reference [CEL \(Collaborator and Language Expert\)](#) for information on the courses and to take the suitability test (idoneità). The same applies if you hold a certificate: contact the reference CEL to find out what you should do.

Eligibility tests must be passed by the January 2023 session.

Before publishing the final rankings, the CLA will publish the language assessment scores of individual candidates, who will have the opportunity to report any anomalies.
