You may already be aware that the UK government is making improvements to deliver a more streamlined, digital immigration system which will be quicker and more secure for the millions of people who pass through the UK border each year.

**Electronic Travel Authorisations (ETAs)** are being introduced worldwide for visitors to the UK who do not currently need a visa for short stays, or who do not already have a UK immigration status prior to travelling.

The introduction of ETAs is in line with the approach many other countries have taken to border security.

We would be grateful if you could share the following details with any single semester students you have coming to study at the University of Leeds from January 2025. We will also be communicating this information directly with students via our pre-arrival newsletters, which we encourage them to read carefully.

## **Key dates**

Eligible **non-Europeans** can apply for an ETA from 27 November 2024 and will need an ETA to travel to the UK from 8 January 2025 onwards.

Eligible **Europeans** can apply for an ETA from 5 March 2025 and will need an ETA to travel to the UK from 2 April 2025 onwards.

## **Key points**

- Although European students will not need an ETA when they first arrive in the UK in January 2025, if they intend to travel outside the UK during the Easter break (28 March 2025 28 April 2025), they will need an ETA to return for the final weeks of teaching and exams.
- Students can apply for an ETA from within the UK.
- Dual nationals who hold a British or Irish passport do not need to apply for an ETA.
- ETAs are linked to passports, not people, so students should apply with the passport they intend to use to travel to the UK.
- An ETA costs £10 and permits multiple journeys to the UK for stays of up to six months at a time over two years or until the holder's passport expires whichever is sooner.
